

Level 1 What To Wear?

Wearing a uniform helps create a sense of unity among our students and allows them to fully immerse themselves in the dance experience. Additionally, it provides a safe and practical environment for dancers to move freely without any hindrances.

Wearing the dance class uniform also helps our instructors in assessing and correcting posture, alignment, and technique more effectively. It allows them to observe each dancer's movements clearly and offer personalized guidance to ensure proper form and development. By ensuring that all students come to class in the proper uniform, we can maintain a focused and productive learning environment for all dancers.

Uniform colors are required, but the provided Dancin' Dreams leotard is not. Dancers may dress in any leotard of their liking as long as it matches their level's color!

In Ballet Class I Can Wear...

We politely ask for no skirts in our younger level classes. Skirts become a distraction and instructors cannot correct body position & alignment properly. Dancers may put on a skirt for disco party at the end of class if they already have one or would like to dance with one!

Ballet shoes & tights can be found at a local dancewear store or online! Students are allowed to wear pink or skin toned ballet shoes & tights to class. These special shoes will be worn for all performances, so please make sure they are pink or skin toned. Do not wear outside!

Hair should be pulled back in a neat bun for each class. This helps our dancers stay focused on dance and not distracted, touching or re-doing their hair during class time. We understand that hair can be intimidating for first time dance parents. We have different tutorials we can send your way to learn how to do this hairstyle.

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In Jazz & Tap Class I Can Wear...

During Jazz class, dancers will wear their same colored leotard, and may add form-fitted black shorts or leggings on top of the uniform. Tights must be worn under all bottoms!

Dancers will wear tan jazz shoes (no black jazz shoes) during dance class. Tan jazz shoes follow the leg line when wearing tights, and dancers will use these shoes for recitals!

During Tap class, dancers will stay in their same Jazz uniform.

We strongly recommend jazz tap shoes at this level. Dancers are encouraged to start learning how to tie their tap shoes so that shoe changes can become easier as they grow.

Hair should be pulled back in a ponytail, pigtails, or bun. Dancer's hair should remain out of their face so they may work on turns and leaps without hair flying in their face.

If your dancer has long or hard to manage hair (falls out of a ponytail frequently), we highly recommend sending them to Jazz & Tap class in a bun.
